



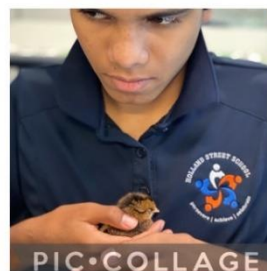
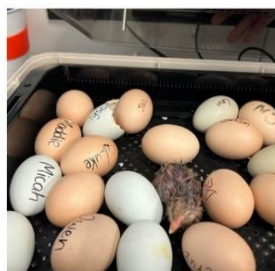
## Week 6 Mini Newsletter
